Principal's Pause

It is tough to believe but yet another school year is nearly behind us. We have seen our students grow so much this year. It is truly amazing to see the progress made by those little brains absorbing everything around them like a sponge. However, there is still lots of learning and fun to be had. I always marvel at how we attempt (and generally succeed) in cramming 3 months-worth of events into the month of May before hitting the crescendo on May 23rd, our final day of this 2018-2019 school year. Below I will wrap up some spring highlights from this year and then give some important news for the summer.

We were very pleased this spring to have two deserving teachers in our midst who were awarded some very prestigious honors. Trisha Ridener, our long-time librarian and “utility player” extraordinaire, took home the Florence Rotary Club “Teacher of the Year.” Her teaching expertise and “service above self” (the Rotarian motto) helped win her this award. Our other honoree was Jackie Sheaffer who is our reading interventionist. Mrs. Sheaffer was nominated for not only the phenomenal job she does helping our struggling readers, but also all the “extras” she brings to our school such as staff trainings and tutoring of students on her own time. These two fabulous ladies continue a strong tradition of award-winning-caliber teaching which takes place at Walton-Verona Elementary. These awards are highly competitive and only a few are given. We applaud Mrs. Ridener and Mrs. Sheaffer who certainly both have resumes capable of their individual achievements.

Speaking of Mrs. Sheaffer, the grant through which she is paid, is guaranteed for yet another year. We were notified this spring that our grant renewal was re-awarded by the state. This makes 13 consecutive years that we have held the distinction of having a “Read to Achieve” grant teacher in our building. There are 300 grants awarded around the entire state of Kentucky. Each time we have to renew, it is never a foregone conclusion that we will have this valuable allotment of state funds. It is truly a blessing but we are also blessed to have such a gifted teacher in the role; our award-winning Jackie Sheaffer. She has touched so many young lives by giving them a chance to read at grade level. What’s more, she has sparked the LOVE of reading in so many of her students.

Coming up this May (the week of May 6th to be precise), we will embark on yet another round of the state assessment known as KPREP. Each year our 3rd and 4th graders get those #2 pencils sharpened up and come to school ready to give it their all on the reading, math and science portions of the test. We will utilize the bulk of the day during this week to conduct these crucial assessments. KPREP, as many of you know, is the test by which we are “graded” as a school. These tests include multiple choice sections as well as some written portions. During this week, it is vital that our students not only come to school, but come to school rested and ready for KPREP action. We tell our students they need to have eaten a descent breakfast and have had plenty of sleep the night before. And above all else, each day we have to have 100% effort from our kids. They may not know the answer to every question, but we do need them to try their best and come out feeling like they “left it on the court” (to use a basketball phrase). Our school and district have a long-held tradition of doing well on the state assessment. I’m sure this particular group will make us proud once again.

The month of May, as I said, is jam-packed with events for our elementary students and parents. As we head into the long summer break, we want to warn you of a very alarming trend which plagues not only many kids in our district but, indeed, our country. What I'm referring to is the notion of the "Summer Slide." Summer Slide, as experts call it, is the loss of reading and math ability (sometimes up to 2 months-worth of decline) due to the impact of not practicing regularly. Experts have also found that this trend is even more alarming in our homes where access to appropriate reading material, educational experiences and language and math based interactions are not the norm. So how do you avoid the dreaded Summer Slide? The solutions are quite simple. Read with your child or have your child read to you each day. The material doesn't have to be a book per se. You could read a comic book, the back of cereal box, Pokémon cards or even signs along a road. The same can be done with math. You don't have to have a math workbook to be engaged with numbers (adding, subtracting, counting etc.). Money and basic shapes have all kinds of math connections. Even playing board games that involve counting spaces or moving after rolling dice definitely combine to help the neurons in your brain make more stable connections around those particular topics. The best part is, you can even HAVE FUN while doing these things. The point is, try to interact in an educational way with your child for just a few minutes a day over the summer break. This will help you student come back to school ready to "hit the ground running."

I leave you with a little more information you can use for the summer before the 2019-2020 school year. Don't forget our school supply lists can be found in the summer edition of the mirror and also on-line at wv.kyschools.us under "news." We will also be using the Infinite Campus messenger system to send out district-wide alerts to changes such as a posting to the website. For those of you eager to know who your child's teacher will be for the upcoming school year, the class rosters are not posted anywhere. To find out, you will have to call or email school starting July 8th. You must be in good standing with your lunch account and school fees in order to have "early bird" look at your child's teacher's name. Other news which will be posted at a later date will include Back-To-School Nights, New Student Orientations, Kindergarten Orientation and Screening, Preschool Orientation Night, and PTA events planned for the beginning of the school year.

From all of us at Walton-Verona Elementary, have a great end to the 2018-19 school year and here's to a wonderful and exciting 2019-20. We wish our exiting 4th graders nothing but the best as they venture on to our middle school. For the rest of our student body and their parents, we look forward to seeing everyone again on August 8th.

Nikole was honored at an awards luncheon on Monday, April 22nd where she received a \$250 check to be donated to the charity of her choice as well as some special recognition pieces for her own keeping.

Asbestos Management Plan for Walton-Verona Schools

This notice is being issued to insure that you know that the Walton-Verona Board of Education is in compliance with both national and state regulations and laws that relate to building materials which contain asbestos that have been used in building construction in past years.

An inspection for building materials which contain asbestos has been completed for all buildings owned by Walton-Verona Board of Education. This inspection has been conducted by a certified inspector and the material samples were evaluated by an accredited laboratory. Building materials with as little asbestos as one percent (1%) have been identified and made part of a management plan for the school system.

A complete asbestos management plan for the school system is on file at the Walton-Verona Board of Education office. Also, a copy of the asbestos management plan for each individual school is on file in each building principal's office.

We will continue to notify you at least once each year on the status of the management plan. Should it be necessary, more frequent updates will be issued as a result of an additional inspection, normal surveillance practices, response actions, or remodel work which might disturb building material which contain asbestos. Every precaution will continue to be used to protect the well-being of students and employees of the Walton-Verona Schools.

Directory Information

From time-to-time school-related groups and organizations ask for the addresses of students or graduates. Examples of these groups include the PTSA, Music Parents Association (WVMPA), WAVE Foundation, Alumni Association, class reunion groups, Military recruiters, and so on. If you object to having this information released, please contact the appropriate school or district office.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE REQUEST

Attention Parents: Should your child need to be *absent for 5 days or more* due to illness, surgery, hospital stay, or certain extenuating circumstances, please contact the school where he/she attends. HOMEBOUND INSTRUCTION is available for students that have a qualifying ailment verified in advance by a doctor. Homebound Instruction allows your child to keep up with his/her school work and he/she is not counted absent while in this program.

Over the last 12 years, more than 335 students have taken part in the summer strength and conditioning program at the Walton-Verona High School Fitness Center. The program has been a huge success. Students have worked hard and have seen great improvements in strength and endurance. The strength and conditioning program will be offered again this summer for any student that is serious about increasing his or her fitness level.

Program will include:

- Sport specific strength training program
- Cardiovascular training for endurance
- Instruction on proper eating habits
- Quickness training (plyometrics)
- Flexibility training

The program will start the first Monday after school is out and will run through the end of the summer (except for the dead period which is the last week of June and first week of July). The program is every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday.

There is also a program for you. This program is geared towards general fitness and conditioning. Last year we had 9 adults take part, and they had a great time working together to achieve their fitness goals.

Program Includes

- Individualized programs will be set up based on your current activity level and experience.

The program will start the first Monday after school is out (Monday, June 3th this year) and will run through the end of the summer (Aug 2nd). The program is every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 8:00 am – 9:00 am.

- Cost includes all aspects of the program including personal instruction from ACE Certified Personal Trainer (Clint Coleman)
